TRIDUUM (USCCB WEBSITE)

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are:

- Mass of the Lord's Supper
- Good Friday of the Lord's Passion
- Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord

As we enter the Easter Triduum, it will be celebrated like most of us have never experienced before. Because of the corona virus, we are to practice social distancing and not gather in groups. Palms were distributed and yes we were able to hear the mass via face book or other streaming means. We will continue from Holy Thursday through the evening of Easter Sunday to celebrate the unfolding of Christ's Paschal Mystery in the same way.

Archbishop Wester asks us that "This Holy Week Home is the Holy Place." We as Cursillistas have a great gift in the Tripod – Piety, Study and Action. We can make our homes holy through our practices of piety, study and action. Continue offering your day to Lord, set aside time to pray, pray the rosary, and examine your conscience daily. If possible watch daily mass. Listen

to the scriptures and meditate on what Our Lord is asking of us during this specific time and place. This is a great time to read scripture and share with those in our homes. Reach out to someone either by phone or email; maybe someone you have not seen or heard from in sometime.

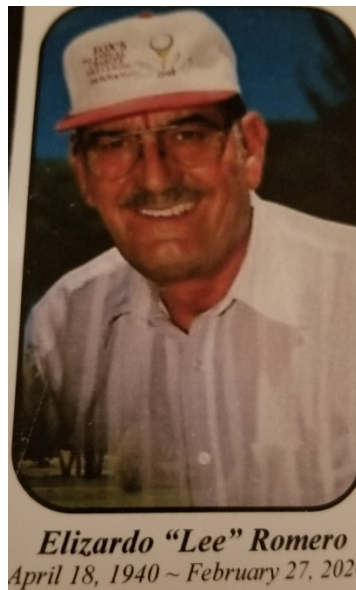
